Simon Dell is currently the Director and Co-ordinator of Moorland Guides. He spent many years in the Police Service including seventeen at Tavistock Police Station as Community Constable. In 1997 he was awarded the MBE for service to the community as well as Mountain Rescue. He is now a free-lance writer with a special interest in Dartmoor, industrial archaeology and also Lundy Island and as well as leading local Dartmoor walks he has undertaken several expeditions to both the North and South sides of Mount Everest.

We are very fortunate that Simon can come to talk to us on the fascinating history of Tavistock Abbey from its founding in 974AD to the dissolution of the monasteries in 1539 and its remains in the landscape of Tavistock.


