#### **Brentor Commons Association**

If you have been on the commons in recent weeks you will have obviously noticed that the paths have been cut on Bowden Down making it much easier to get around, especially if your dog has short legs! Roger Emmett kindly did this for us—thank you to him as it's hit and miss whether County Council will do it.

The Tavistock Taskforce have fenced off one of the old mineshafts on Bowden as we felt it was beginning to show signs of sinking. They are also going to replace quite a few of the posts around the shafts in the main mine area. Loads of butterflies around in this hot weather on both commons—Meadow Browns, Ringlets and the day flying Chimney Sweep moth.

Another moth trapping took place on Wednesday evening, we are now up to 158 species recorded. Notable captures were a beautiful Privet Hawk Moth and an Elephant Hawk Moth.

On Saturday the 20th we ran two events with the Devon Mammal Group, a small mammal trapping survey and a bat detecting evening. We placed almost 50 traps on both Downs filled with hay, Apple and maggot casters for the mammals to feed on if they were trapped. At 9pm a group of us helped by a bat expert walked around both commons until 11.00 pm with bat detectors. There were great results including a "bat storm" on the road between Bowden and Liddaton Downs with all of the detectors chattering away whilst a group of Pipistrells flew just above us feeding on the insects that our lights attracted. On Sunday morning we re-assembled to check the traps good results, Woodmice(11), Bankvoles(5) and one Field vole. Ellie Knott from the Devon Mammal Group also confirmed that some of the chewed hazelnuts that we have found have been eaten by Dormice, so this confirms that we have Dormice, certainly on Bowden Down. So all in all a very successful event, and a big thanks to all who came along and to the Devon Mammal Group who provided the equipment and expertise.

#### **PROPOSED HOUSING**

Figures have now been collated from the Housing Needs Survey conducted in July 2018 and the 2 public presentation days. The presentations were very well attended and figures show that the development is oversubscribed by local people who will be eligible to live there. The latest data indicates a need for 11 affordable homes and 6 open market homes, which meet the criteria for an affordable development as required by WDBC and DNPA. The planned development remains fixed at 12 properties. Further progress has been slightly delayed due to the recent elections, but it is understood that the plans will be submitted to DNPA shortly with a planning decision expected in September. Construction should then commence late Autumn or early next year.
