#### **Brentor Commons**



The Brentor Commons Association held two tree planting mornings on Bowden Down at the end of November. Two very hardy groups of volunteers planted over 300 native trees to supplement ones which we have planted over the past 15 years. The trees were given to us by The Woodland Trust, a mixture of Oak, Rowan, Birch, Hazel, Hawthorn, Holly, Wild Cherry & Willow. All have tree guards to protect them against being nibbled by deer and rabbits; these are removed and reused. It was a great effort in difficult conditions but well worth it as we are enhancing bio-diversity on the common by providing cover, food and homes for a very wide range of wildlife.

2019 has been a very active and productive year for the Commons. We have had new surveys of our bat, moth and small mammal populations and this information will be added to Devon's Bio-diversity records. We can now add the

Greater and Lesser Horseshoe bats, 211 different species of moths and Dormice to our list.

The Small Mammal trapping and bat detecting events were fascinating and well attended by humans and creatures alike - we intend to continue with these events in 2020.

The Tavistock Taskforce has completed various pieces of work for us on both Downs and will be continuing throughout

2020. They are a fantastic organisation who not only complete conservation work for us but provide work experience and training for a wide range of people with special needs.

The Holloway walk has proved to be very popular since being opened up; it provides cover and stunning views over the Burcombe Valley, Dartmoor and up to the Tor. We will be providing a few "rustic" benches to sit on. These will be placed on Bowden Down in the coming weeks - in response to requests from locals who walk the commons regularly and really need a few strategic "perching" places if they are to keep using the Commons for their walks.

Finally, on a sad note, we had another Flytipping issue when 25 paviors were thrown into the undergrowth on Liddaton Down a couple of weeks ago. 20 of them were perfectly OK and could be used again. They must have chucked from the back of a truck or a trailer to get them so far into the undergrowth; strangely enough a pick up with trailer was seen parked up by the crossroads by a regular walker from the Chillaton area.
