Parish Council.

A meeting of the Brentor Parish Council was held on Monday 9th November in the Village Hall. The following are extracts from the Council Meeting and are not yet approved.

Declaration of Acceptance. Mr. Baskerville welcomed Mr. Foy to the meeting and invited him to sign the Acceptance of Order form. Mr. Foy was congratulated on becoming a Parish Councillor.

Speed Limit through the Village. The Chairman welcomed Sergeant Pimm to the meeting. Many ideas for reducing the speed of traffic through the village were discussed as well as other problems concerning the village.

Matters raised.

1. The possibility of a large increase in Heavy Goods Vehicles.

2. Continued high speed of traffic on Brentor to Lydford road,

3. Traffic calming ideas within the village.

4. Lack of vision at Whitfield's corner junction.

5. Possibility of a one way system from Brentor Inn to Rowden Farm. Sergeant Pimm said he would look into the possibility of a 30 mile speed limit and weight restriction through the village. He also

commented on crime prevention.

Local Housing Needs Survey. The Clerk read a letter from Mrs. Farley, W.D.B.C. Housing Manager pointing out that nobody within the parish of Brentor has registered a need for housing with W.D.B.C. There is little that can be done to address the situation if people are not willing to come forward and register their needs. Mrs. Farley asked if the council had any further ideas as to how to encourage people to come forward to register. The Clerk suggested she write for leaflets and posters on local housing, these could be displayed in prominent locations throughout the village.
