## 'Countywide' - Half fare travel scheme.

'Countywide' is Devon' County Council's half fare travel scheme. 'Countywide' passes can be used on all buses and trains within Devon (single or day return), after 9am weekdays, all day weekends and bank holidays. Who ismeligible?

(A). Men over the age of 65 and women over 60.

(B). Those aged over 16 but not over 18 and who are undergoing fulltime education.

(C).Mentally handicapped, pattially sighted, blind and/ or hard of hearing.

(D). Persons suffering from any disability/injury which, in the opinion of the administering authority, seriously impairs their ability

(E). Berwon's unable to drive for medical reasons.

(F). Companions travelling with severely disabled people.

How long does a pass last? How much does it cost?

Passes are valid for 3 or 12 months, available from any Post Office in Devon or Devon General Ltd ticket office, at a maximum price of £6.50 and £24.00 respectively. HOWEVER.

For eligible residents in BRENTOR the pass price is 12 months £12.00 3 months £3.75.
