PROPOSED NEW VILLAGE HALL

Fund raising has started for the new hall. It is important to know at this stage what sort of building the people of the village want. To this end we would like everybody to consider how they see the hall being used in the future and to complete the following questionnaire.

Using this information we will take up an offer made by a villager to draw up a plan incorporating the ideas put forward taking into consideration the design of other halls. This plan will form the basis on which a proper architect's drawing with costings can be made. It is important that everybody gets a chance to make a contribution to this process.

The present hall is roughly 40 ft by 30 ft with one main space of 40 ft by 20 ft. There is a kitchen of about 15 ft by 10 ft and a ladies and gents toilets. There is a double door entrance which is reached by steps with a porch and a rear exit. The floor is wooden, there are gas heaters and wooden framed windows. There is no disabled access.
