Brentor Garden Club, 'Fun with Fuchsias'

Not only 'fun with fuchsias', but fun with Carol Richards! Now President of the Camborne & Redruth Fuchsia Society, Carol claimed to be "unashamedly Cornish", and her sense of humour was infectious.

Fuchsia flowers range from 1/8" to 2 or 3" across, and come in a huge array of shapes – far more than most of us had imagined. There is evidence that they were flowering in the high Andes 100 million years ago, and spread as far as Antarctica. They have died out in Australia, and New Zealand is home to species with blue pollen, and yellow flowers with no petals. However, there are about 12,000 cultivars across the world, many having been discovered and transported by Europeans.

In a fascinating talk and demonstration, interspersed with jokes, Carol explained how to take cuttings, pot them up, and start training the plants into a variety of shapes. Using slivers of ladies' tights, she tied stems to stakes to encourage twisted growth, and by pinching out shoots in different places she produced bush and standard plants. Rings, fans and pillars added to the selection of possible shapes. Fuchsias can also be trimmed and trained to produce delightful Bonsai plants: one of her samples was 10 years old, but it takes only 2 or 3 years at most to produce a mature growth.

Carol completed her talk with a lovely selection of slides of fuchsias, other plants,

and her cat Ben! Amongst others, she showed Fuchsia 'phyllis', which can be grown for the fruits, which make good jam, and also the insectivorous plant Sundew, which can be kept in the greenhouse to keep down whitefly and other pests.

The next Garden Club event will be a visit to Carol Klein's garden in North Devon on Thursday 17th July.
