Brentorians review

Everyone was laughing (and a few were crying) in this farce about lies, mistaken identities and cross-dressing that obviously delighted audience and actors alike, and confused everyone including the cast at times – to great comic effect! Centred around a fraudulent landlord claiming all manner of different benefits for fictitious tenants, the cast of 10 put in some wonderful performances building up to a crescendo of deceit, hilarity and eventually utter madness.

Landlord Eric Swann was played with great comic timing and a distinct air of Basil Fawlty by Alan Henbest, with Glenys Mason as his irate wife doing a splendid line in hysteria. Robin Burdfield put in a very funny performance as Norman the lodger sliding from indignation to reluctant collusion (somehow ending up as a deaf piano-

tuner) and a DSS officer was played with great aplomb (and ultimately drunkenness) and a truly terrible wig by John Wheeler. Mention must also go to Phil Pearson's Uncle George, for a fine stutter and for playing (nearly) dead for most of the performance and to Sue Rhodes as Dr Chapman for keeping a straight face whilst discussing the finer nuances of Eric's cross-dressing.....

This play had some great characters, all played nicely dead-pan (for the most part!) by the rest of the cast Nicky Harmer (Bereavement Counsellor), Anne Clarke (DSS Official), Phillipa Griffiths (Norman's fiancé) and Joe Kuipers (as a very confused undertaker) and some sharp lines delivered so fast it really warranted a second viewing.

On the production side, Cash On Delivery featured probably the best special effects that I've seen in any of their performances to date, including a rampaging washing machine and a smoking briefcase courtesy of Alan Henbest. Colin Dawes produced an extremely professional set and was responsible for sound and lighting. Directors Judy Baxter and Gaye Martin and the rest of the production team really must be congratulated on a great production and a hugely enjoyable evening out. I must say that preperformance wine was a winner all round and definitely helped to oil the wheels.

Well done Brentorians – you did it again!
