Brentor Garden Club Members Meeting on 21st May 2009.

Talk on Peas, Beans and Dahlias from Brian Wonnacott.

Brian comes from a farming family originating in North Devon, he is a member of the Dahlia Society. Brians love of gardening is very clear, he showed many photographs of his prize winning Dahlias. Unfortunately this winter he lost much of his stock to wet and frost, from 150 tubers he has managed to salvage only 25. He advises that when the tubers are lifted at the start of winter that they should be hung upside down to drain any moisture before they are stored away, this may avoid some damage by frost during the very cold months. He advises that cuttings are best grown in a mixture of compost and pearlite, having first been dipped into root powder. After about 2 weeks these should form a good system. As an interim to planting out, cuttings should be transplanted into a mixture of your own garden soil and compost to avoid shock when they are eventually planted into the garden.

Brian has saved his own runner bean seed for the past 25 years, so cannot say which variety he grows. He plants several hundred plants a year, many of which he gives to family and friends. He uses root trainer trays, these are about 5" long and open out like a spectacle case. They are very successful and give a long root system to the young plants for planting on. These trays are also very good for growing peas and sweetpeas. This was a very enjoyable evening, it was a great pleasure to listen to someone who had so many years of knowledge to share.

Brentor Common Association Solstice BBQ

BCA held a very successful first barbecue on Bowden Down on Sunday 21st June to celebrate the longest day and to look at some of the conservation activities that have been carried out in recent months. A total of 26 adults and 6 children enjoyed a relaxing evening eating and drinking the various provisions brought for the barbecue and sharing a delicious range of salad contributions. A few braved the selfsupporting hammocks provided but most enjoyed their supper from the relative safety of the camp chairs and rugs with a glorious view of St Michael de Rupe on Brentor. The weather was perfect and everyone seemed to be having a lovely time.

The aim of the BCA on Bowden Down is to enhance the wildlife value of the site by restoring the former heathland habitat and sympathetically managing the other habitats within the site; and encouraging the local community in Brentor, Liddaton and surrounds to enjoy this beautiful area of common land. This month's conservation activity is Bracken control or 'Bracken bruising'. By towing a special roller behind a quad bike the highly invasive bracken fronds are weakened, severely reducing their vigour and thereby helping the heathland habitat to regenerate. Volunteers are always welcome to help with this activity, and others on the common. It's fairly straight forward and not too strenuous. Contact BCA Land Manager Will Walker-Smith on 01822 810165.
