Stop Press! Great News for the Village Hall!

The Village Hall and Playing Field Committee is very pleased to announce that the first phase of refurbishment of Brentor Village Hall is expected to commence in early October. **After almost two years of planning and fundraising some £170,000 has been raised** towards the cost of the project from a wide variety of public and charitable sources.

Although exact dates have yet to be finalised, it is expected that the hall will close for about six months from the end of September. The existing toilets, kitchen and store will be demolished and replaced with much better facilities including new toilets, a catering-standard kitchen, entrance hall and larger store. There will be full access for people with disabilities, including an entrance ramp and disabled persons' toilet. Some work will also be carried out on the hall itself to make it safer and more comfortable and to extend its useful life.

We are urgently looking for a dry and secure storage space for the Hall's chairs and tables while the building work is being done – if you can help please contact Dave Williams on 810375.

The Committee regrets that the hall will be out of action for up to six months but is sure everyone will agree that the outcome of the refurbishment will make the inconvenience more than worthwhile. Many activities will inevitably be affected by the closure, but it is hoped that a few of our regular fundraising events will be able to continue in some form during the winter. We still need income to maintain the playing field and pay for ongoing costs to the Hall, so perhaps you may be able to help by holding a small event in your home or somewhere in the village – please contact Dave Williams if you have any ideas.

Next month's issue of *Brentor News* will carry more detail about our fundraising successes and the work to be done to the Hall.

Steam returns to Brentor Station after 40 years
