Garden Club

There was a lot of itching and scratching at the monthly garden club meeting on Thursday 17th June in the newly refurbished village hall!Our speaker, however, Tim Ellis of Ellis Nurseries and Gardens Polyphant, made the evening comfortable with his light hearted and very informative talk and slide show.It is a huge common problem that all gardeners and nurserymen face-how to kindly get rid of all the pests!



One lovely idea was to have some small call ducks who love eating the slugs-but obviously some areas of the garden need to be fenced off from them! They will happily walk along rows of pots clearing the slugs as they go without harming the plants. Snails however are more cunning and lurk in crevices until there is damp weather-they are slugs with shells.

There are many natural predators of slugs and snails-birds, hedgehogs and these need encouraging into the garden. A half wooden barrel filled with straw will make a wonderful home for hedgehogs and plenty of bird boxes near the most vulnerable plants. If using pellets to control these pests there are new safer iron based products that are made of natural ingredients.

During the evening Tim showed us the plants he had brought along with him that slugs and snails find unpalatable –viola, dicentra, astible and many others.

There was also the table top sale and a draw.

After the talk tea and coffee and cake were served and Tim was then available to answer the many questions we all had. Parish Council News

At the AGM of the Brentor Parish Council held on May 17th the result of the election of officers for the year was as follows:-

Chairman - John Burrows Vice-Chairman - Paul Webster

As many of you will know at the end of 2009 the Wheelwright's Stone, a valuable and historic artefact of Brentor Parish, was moved from its original location of operation, to a position adjacent to private property. Following a full review and a study of documentary evidence, the council voted unanimously that the stone be returned to its original position, appropriately secured.

At the recent Annual Parish Meeting various issues were raised which the Council has an obligation to discuss. The issues raised included School Transport to Tavistock College, Affordable Housing, Beating the Bounds.

It was reported that Devon CC had reworked the bus timetable so that the school bus leaves Brentor 5 minutes later. Pupils now arrive at Tavistock College around 8:15am.

Concerns over possible housing development which would lead residents moving from the village were reported. The council decided that it should refrain from any action which would cause residents this level of anxiety.

The council voted to give their full support to the suggestion raised at the Annual Parish Meeting by Helen de Carles to hold a beating of the bounds sometime in 2011. Any parishioners with information on previous beating of the bounds should contact her on 810412.

As most people will know all proposals for unitary authority status and/or local government reorganisation in Devon have been abandoned.

Please note that Parish Council Meetings are open to the public. At the start of each meeting there is time set aside for any person to make a representation on any matter whatsoever. The council will take account of what is said or requested but is under no obligation to further act. However, this is the ideal forum if you have an issue about which you think the council needs to be aware.

 - At the end of the evening you will feel a warm glow from the good food, convivial company and knowledge that you have supported many small local producers and your own village Hall – and then you will have a short walk home.
