Mary Tucker

It is with great sadness that we report the death of Mary on October 18th. She was a true Brentorian having lived all her life in the village that she came to know and love. She was born Mary Brimacombe at Nutshell on 28 July 1928 She attended Brentor school, on the site of the former Church Hall and, at the age of 11, went on to Senior School at Dolvin Road in Tavistock. After leaving school she worked for her Grandfather in the village shop and bakery. On occasions she joined the delivery van taking fresh bread and groceries to Lydford, Mary Tavy & Peter Tavy. Later she was employed in the offices at Sweets, the Ladies' Gentlemens' Outfitters in Tavistock, where she was affectionately known as "Brim".

On 8 September 1956 she married Bill Tucker and became a committed farmers wife, firstly at Yellands (now Kilimanjaro) with Bills' parents and then at Bearwood where they've been involved in the farm ever since. Mary was not afraid of hard work and would willingly take on whatever jobs she could. In spring she could be seen feeding orphan lambs through the bars of the gate next to the bungalow. Already a devoted wife Mary became a loving Mother to Nick and Cathryn. She was happiest amongst her family with her parents and parents in law always being close at hand; looking after them in their times of need too. As part of the ongoing commitment to her family Mary learnt to drive relatively late in life, especially to ensure Nick & Cath did not miss out on social events outside Brentor.



Mary was a regular member of the congregation at Christchurch, Brentor throughout her life. She was christened, confirmed and married there. She took a great pride in decorating the church with flowers, both Christchurch in the village and St Michael's on the Tor. The font was always her responsibility at Christchurch at festival times and at Harvest Festival she would festoon the font with flowers, berries, fruit and vegetables. As part of this commitment Mary planted her own garden with flowers and shrubs most suited to church decorating at all times of the year! When she could no longer climb the Tor she would send money to buy flowers for the decorating.

Throughout her life Mary took a keen interest in many village activities. She was a founder member of the Young Conservatives in Brentor and has remained a party member until recently. She was a member of the choir at Christchurch, played an active part in the production of the Brentorians plays and served on the PCC, Parochial Church Council, for many years. It has been said that Mary always came up with the "sensible" approach to all fundraising and social events. At one time she was renowned for her sponges at any event involving refreshments

During retirement Mary and Bill enjoyed many coach trips together, meeting new friends and holidaying all over England, Wales and Scotland - a very long way away from home for Mary! Her greatest relaxation was to watch "old films" on TV by the fire of course! Mum was almost always cold. "Cold hands, warm heart" she used to say! It was certainly true in her case. She also enjoyed writing and receiving letters; in particular to relatives in America and also to a young girl, called Pat who was evacuated to Station House, Brentor during the war. Mum has kept in touch with her and her family ever since. Mum enjoyed rhyming poetry and would often include one with her letters.

Blessed with good health for most of her life Mary did suffer with heart problems during the last 20 months. Each time she frightened us all with a spell in hospital, her faith in God helped in her determination to come home again. She loved Bill, Bearwood and Brentor. She often said that it was where she wanted to end her days, and apart from her last 2 weeks in hospital she was able to do just that.

Mary was a very dignified and determined lady who was greatly respected and admired by many. We will always miss her and always remember her with great affection.

A Memorial Service will be held for Mary Tucker in Christ Church on Friday 29th October at 2:00pm
