# PARISH COUNCIL NEWS ....

The Parish Council met on 27th April nd welcomed John Weston as the newly elected member. (Well done John! Better luck next time Gill!) (Ed.) Mr Basson (County Emergency Officer) attended to address the Council and public about the Parish War Emergency Plan. He admitted that parts of the plan were inadequate to give a high level of protection to the public but said it was important to do something. He was under the impression that those who criticised the plan were against civil defence but this was corrected and it was pointed out that nobody had suggested that civil defence should be ignored. On the contray what is suggested in the Parish War Emergency plan is very minimal and inadequate and encourages people to believe that they have a good chance of surviving People are encoraged to read the plan for themselvesa nuclear war. it is available in the Post Office for the public to see and inform themselves. The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on June 22nd and there will be further discussion of the Plan. \*\*\*The Parish Council's response to a questionnaire associated with the Tavistock and District Plan for development is available in the Post Office.

SOCIAL CAR SCHEME? The Parish Council is anxious to see if anybody in the Village is interested in being the voluntary organiser for a scheme. The idea is that the organiser puts people who need lifts in touch with volunteer drivers who get paid a mileage rate for conveying the person. ## A DATE TO REMEMBER ...

The field cannot be sold by the D.P.F. Co. Ltd. and is for the use of all, so please come along to help elect the new Committee.
