CHURCH NEWS

The Parochial Church Council (the PCC for short) is the democratically elected body within the local church which is responsible for the day-to-day running of church matters within the Parish. It meets at regular intervals during the year and discusses and decides upon matters related to such things as the pattern of services, the up-keep of the fabric of the church properties and the collection and expenditure of church funds.

Meetings of such bodies are not always as stimulating and exciting as the idealist might hope and they are often lengthy as well as sometimes being indecisive. But there is little doubt that members of the PCC take their duties seriously and seek Christian guidance in their discussions and for their decisions. With a relatively small Church Membership - there are only just over 50 on the Parochial Church Roll - the affairs are not easily administered, particularly when there are two separate church buildings to be maintained and costs are constantly rising.

The Council have recently spent some £1600 on repairs and re-pointing at St Michael's Church on the Tor and further work is needed at Christ Church as soon as possible. The Parish has to find some £2000 each year now for its quota to the Diocesan authorities which goes towards clergy salaries, pensions and other central expenses. On the other hand, income is not rising to meet all the increased costs.

In spite of all these local financial problems, the PCC have been anxious to ensure that a reasonable amount of money goes from the Church funds to outside charities and Christian works. At a recent meeting of the Council it was therefore decided, quite courageously, to allocate so far as possible 10% of gross income in any one year to "outward giving".

The work of the local parish church affects and provides facilities for many more in the village than the 50 church members on the Parochial Church Roll and it relies very much on the generosity of the many to provide its funds. The PCC have reason to be especially grateful to Dr Elmes of Mary Tavy, who with Mrs Elmes is a regular worshipper at Brentor, for a handsome gift of money recently towards Church funds.

Receipe for the Month

CHEESEY RED CABBAGE

2 tbsp Cooking Oil	2 Colves Garlic
1 lge. Onion	2 Carrots
2 Sticks Celery	2oz Mushrooms
1 Courgette	Small Green Pepper
1 lb Red Cabbage	Salt & Pepper
14 oz Tin Tomatoes	

Optional: Chopped peanuts, sliced leek, any leftover vegetables, e.g. sweetcorn, peas, green beans, cauliflower.

1 oz Butter
2 oz Flour (I use wholemeal)
½ pint Milk
3 oz Grated Cheese

Method... Heat oil, fry chopped garlic and onion gently together in large saucepan. Add sliced carrots, celery, courgette, chopped pepper and mushrooms. Cover and fry gently together for about 10 minutes. Meanwhile shred and wash cabbage, then add to vegetables together with tin tomatoes. Cover and cook for about 10-15 minutes, stirring occasionally, until cabbage is cooked. Add salt and pepper. Meanwhile, make cheese sauce. Pour over cabbage.

Tastes good served with baked/mashed potato, sweetcorn, baked tomatoes, mushrooms, leeks, swede or a green vegetable.
