Station View entrance... improvement of visibility is to be reviewed next year by the County Council when there is money available.

Dustbin Collections.... West Devon's reply to the Parish Council's suggested rotation collection of dustbins, was not very optimistic. It stated that the notification and labour programming situations were so difficult and costly that West Devon cannot rotate bin collections. They also do not provide for the weeks of non-collection because of cost.

The Parish Council expressed disatisfaction with this reply and would like our District Councillor, Mr Holt, to follow up this issue further with the Chairman of the Environmental Committee. Village Traffic Concern was expressed at the excessive speed of some traffic through the centre of the village, expecially as so many families with small children live in and around this central area now. It was suggested this could be mentioned to Mr Saunders (Divional road engineer) and Mr Holt in case anything could be done about it. . W.I. Notice Board It was decided that the notice board for the village, provided by the WI is to be placed in the centre of the village opposite Windsor Cottage on the bank below the water shoot. It will be a 24"x18" enclosed board and the Parish Council has agreed that the WI can now go ahead and erect it. Planning Application ... A planning application for stabling for race horses and an adjacent dwelling in the field behind the bus shelter has been made.
