BRENTOR VILLAGE HALL

Many of you will have read about the cancelling of the Village Hall Entertainments Licence in the Western Morning News recently. Perhaps a Few words of explanation.

Despite the fact that we believed the Hall was up to fire regulation standards, following recent improvements, the Fire Authority disagreed and over a year ago only sanctioned a temporary licence, renewed every three months, subject to further work being carried out. Their time allow ance has run out and their licence has therefore been revoked.

The Fire Authority are insisting that the following work be completed:

1. The supposed fire retardant paint, recommended by I.C.I. and applied in
1984 to be stripped from the hall interior and replaced with an approved
fire retardent paint to Class 1 Surface Spread of Flame Rating.

- 2. The gas cylinders, now inside the hall, to be positioned within a compound outside the hall, together with the regulator valve.
- 3. The existing 'break glass' type latch on the fire exit to be replaced by the 'panic bar' type of latch.
- 4. Fire routine nitices to be displayed in the hall.

The above work will cost many hundreds of pounds and will have to be carried out in stages, when funds permit.

Money received from hall bookings has never been sufficient to meet the Hall running costs and we omly balance our books by fund raising events organised by a few members of our committee and supported by many of you.
