She died of leukemia three years ago after a long and spirited fight and on this third walk we intend to raise money for the Plymouth and District Leukemia Fund. The purpose of this fund is to establish proper facilities for the treatment and care of leukemia patients in the South West. This will enable patients to be close to their families during their often long and difficult periods of treatment. Family support is particularly important for young children under treatment.

Do come along and enjoy a beautiful walk among friends. Details of the walk itself and a sponsor form are available on the last page of this edition. All of the money collected will go to the leukemia fund.

THIRD JEAN WHITFIELD MEMORIAL WALK FOR LEUKEMIA TREATMENT AT DERRIFORD

Saturday 23rd. May 1987 Start 11 a.m. prompt.

Mike has explained elsewhere in this issue a little about leukemia and the work of the Plymouth and District Leukemia Fund. help us in raising more money for the fund. Every penny raised will be passed on to assist in equipping the leukemia ward at Derriford. The Health Service with its many needs, has funded the project to a certain level. We need much more to ease and treat those afflicted by this terrible illness and to provide vital equipment. This year we have chosen a beautiful walk to Coryton Valley across the River Lyd, passing along the floor of the valley to the ford at Longham, returning via Langstone Woods and Wortha Mill to the South Brentor footpath and the Village Hall.

ROUTE

Start Village Hall to Cloberry House---Across Bowden and Liddaton commons to Liddaton Green. $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles
Turn right and carry on to the River Lyd at Coryton Mill, past the pretty Providence chapel at Broadpark, on the very edge of our parish. 3 miles
At Coryton Mill cottages, turn right onto the farm lane behind the cottages and walk to the ford at Longham. Cross the river at the ford. $3\frac{3}{4}$ miles
Locate the footpath to Langstone, through the woods (at their best this time of year) to arrive at Brentor Cross. $4\frac{3}{4}$ miles
Carry on down Burn Lane and cross the River Burn, turn right and walk over Blackdown to Wortha Bridge. $6\frac{3}{4}$ miles
Cross the river again and walk up the track to arrive at the start of the South Brentor footpath. Walk along the path and finish at the Village Hall. 8 miles

Note the total distance is 8 miles but you may drop out of the walk after walking through Langstone Woods. The distance to the Village Hall would be $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles
