The following extracts were taken from the Minutes of the meeting held 5th January 1989.

Trees on the Langstone-Lydford Road. The dangerous trees have been marked and felling is in progress. It was agreed the Clerk contact the Dartmoor National Park Authority with a view to some 'Free Trees' as replacements. Mrs. Weston said the large Fir tree in the Church Yard was considered dangerous and regretfully would have to be removed.

Cars parked on the verge at the bottom of Station View Council Houses on the Brentor to Mary Tavy Road. P.C. Base reported that appropriate action had already been taken. Mr. Downing noted that some vehicles had already been removed.

Footpath from Waster to Burnville. The Clerk reported that way marking would be improved at the Burnville end. Mr. Friend said that the kissing gate was still unsatisfactory.

Royal Garden Party 1989. Mrs. J. Venning was nominated as a possible representative.

Lydford Station - Riding Academy. The forthcoming appeal on 24 January regarding the proposed development was discussed. Mr. Blowey and Mrs. Weston would represent the Council.

Parish Precept. To remain at £350.00 as in 1987-88.

Water Authority Portacabins. The Clerk was asked to contact SWWA to ensure the cabins, presently sited adjacent to the Tor car park, were only a short term measure.

### DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL CONCESSIONARY FARES SCHEME

In August 1988 Deven County Council introduced their Countryside Concessionary Fares Travel Scheme. Basically this entitles eligible Devon residents with a countrywide pass to:

Approximately half price fare travel on bus and rail services in the county (excluding long distance coach travel);

Subject to: after 9am on Mondays to Fridays, all day Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays.

There are six catagories of eligible residents:

Waller to A Little one google a Cleanson M

Men over the age of 65 and women over 60.

Persons over the age of 16 but not over 18 and who are undergoing full-time

Mentally handicapped, partially sighted, blind, deaf and dumb persons. Persons suffering from any disability/injury which, in the opinion of the administering authority, seriously impairs their ability to walk. Persons unable to drive for medical reasons.

Companions travelling with severely disabled people.

## HOW AND WHERE DO YOU BUY A COUNTRYSIDE PASS?

- A 3 or 12 month Countywide pass can be bought from any Crown or Sub Post Office in Devon. When applying you will need:
- \* An application form, completed and signed (application forms are available from all Post Offices and the County Council). \* Proof of eligibility

  \*The appropriate fee

- \*A passport style photograph (required for the first application only).

If your application is in order you will be issued with:

- \* A Countywide photocard

  \* A Countywide travel pass
- \* A Countywide travel pass
- \* A blue Countywide wallet to hold the photocard and travel pass.
