EMMA NICHOLSON SUPPORTS OUR SCHOOL TRANSPORT BATTLE

Last Friday, 21st April, the Mary Tavy School playground was crowded with T.V. cameras and reporters from the B.B.C., Channel 4 and many local newspapers all following West Devon MP Emma Nicholson and about 40 protesting parents, children, school governors and parish councilors on a walk from Mary Tavy School to Brentor.

Government guidelines say that children aged eight years and over who travel less than three miles to school are not entitled to free transport. If these children use the school bus their parents must pay £20 per child each term. Despite an appeal to the County Council we have been told we must either pay, supply other transport or walk the route:

We invited Miss Nicholson out to see the route herself and afterwards she said, "It's too far for children and their parents to walk. The route is very dangerous, think of the sleet, snow and even escaped prisoners. I have had long talks and correspondence with the Minister of Education who would like to help but can't because it is solely the responsibility of the Local Education Authority at County Hall. I know they have to have rules but surely there can be exceptions. Walking in these conditions is more relevant to the last century and not this."

The row looks like continuing because at present the Devon County Council are standing by National guidelines.

All the parents would like to thank everyone who supported them. Special thanks to P.C. Larry Base, our Community Policeman, who gallantly escorted us and was the children's centre of attraction.
