#### W.I. NEWS

The last minute change of speaker at the W.I.'s September meeting proved in the event, to be rather appropriate, coinciding as it did with the 50th anniversary of the outbreak of World War 2. Mr. John Weston was speaking of his experiences as a prisoner of war in Poland and of his subsequent recent visit to that country. Taken prisoner early in the war Mr. Weston, with the aid of maps, explained how he and hundreds of other prisoners were transported in the hold of a coal barge and by cattle trucks to various camps until they finally reached a village near Warsaw. there being no school in progress during the war, the school building was used as their prison camp. At the end of the war came a gruelling march and finally freedom. Mr. Weston then showed slides of his recent return to Poland revisiting places and people remembered from those traumatic times. On show also were many items of interest from Mr. Weston's prisoner of war days. A vote of thanks for a most interesting and informative afternoon was proposed by Mrs. Dunkley.

The competition for the most interesting war relic was won jointly by Mrs. Dunkley, Mrs. Pritchard and Mrs. Sibley.

The flower of the month was won by Mrs. Davey, 2nd Mrs. Downing, 3rd Mrs. Pritchard.

Looking ahead there was some discussion about a proposed Open Evening on 10th November and a Coffee and Carols morning in December.
