SIXTH JEAN WHITFIELD MEMORIAL SPONSORED WALK FOR THE RESEARCH AND TREATMENT OF LEUKAEMIA

Many of you will remember Jean, who died of Leukaemia while still fairly young. Every year since then, on or about the anniversary of her death, we have organised a sponsored walk in aid of Leukaemia Research and Treatment. Jean was a very active, happy and highly respected person who believed in people and their welfare. Within the Parish she became Chairperson of our Parish Council.

Over the years a large amount of money has been raised and passed on to the Plymouth and District Leukaemia Fund to help with research and the treatment of local people suffering from this illness. Originally based at Greenbank, the unit is now fully operational at Deriford. The health service provides basic funding but much more is required and will continue to be required until this terrible illness is brought under control. This can only be achieved by on going research.

By popular request we will be keeping to the Langstone, Burnville, South Brentor route. Please help us once again by way of walking, sponsoring, or making a donation. As we do each year, every penny raised will be passed on to the Plymouth and District Leukaemia Fund, for use at Deriford Hospital. The walk will take place on the 19th May.
