# PROPOSED AMALGAMATION OF BRENTOR PLAYING FIELD AND BRENTOR VILLAGE HALL UNDER A NEW CHARITY TO BE ESTABLISHED BY THE CHARITY COMMISSION

Publication in the Parish of the draft of the proposed scheme.

The Charity Commission has now released the draft scheme for the new combined charity. To satisfy the requirements of the law, public notices will be exhibited and the draft scheme made available for public inspection, for a period of 21 days, commencing on Monday 10th September 1990. One public notice will be displayed outside the village hall. A second will be displayed in the playing field and a third will be displayed on the notice board at Christ Church.

The draft scheme may be inspected daily between the hours of 7 p.m. and 8.30 p.m. at the village hall, Brentor. Those wishing to do this should telephone either Dennis Young (MT 620) or Bill Tucker (MT 675) who will arrange for the hall to be open. Any objections to the proposed scheme or suggestions for modifying it should be sent in writing within one month from 10th Sept., to the address shown on the public notices.

It has taken 6 years 9 months to reach this stage. We will have just one month in which to either object, suggest or cont'd ....
