

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Items selected from the minutes of the meeting of the Brentor Parish Council, held on Monday January 19th 1987.

Post Office Closure... No applicant has come forward to run the Post Office, as yet. It was suggested the Brentor News be asked to keep the Parish informed of developments so far. (which are as above.)

Street lighting, Brentor Village... After much discussion the Councillors decided against Street lights because it seemed to be against the wishes of the majority of the villagers and agaibst the compromise suggestion of some lighting from lights outside the Church, as this would have a very limited effect.

The Community Policeman... P C Bushnell will be the Community Policeman for the Brentor area as from February 1st 1987.

Communities Consultative Group... Mrs. Venning agreed to represent the Parish Council.

Sign Posts in the Burn Lane Area of Brentor... The Clerk read a letter she had received from Mr. and Mrs. Wetherbee and Mrs. Hardman stating that "Railway Buffs" from all over England make the pilgrimage to the bridges at the bottom of Burn Lane where the G.W.R. and L.S.W.R. share the cutting and it would add to their enjoyment if the "Bridge Restrictions" sign could be renovated. New signs have been ordered for the playing field junction and also one for the square. The damaged signs along Burn Lane had been repaired and replaced. The weak bridge sign is an unauthorised sign erected many years ago by British Rail; according to the Divisional Surveyor's records this bridge was not a weak structure but these facts will be checked by the structures department.

Gerry's Seat ... Work is in progress.

School children at Lydford Station... The Authority has decided that Children living at Lydford Station will cease to be eligible for free transport to Tavistock School as from Easter 1987. This decision however is the subject of an appeal. The Clerk was asked to write to County Hall expressing the Council's extreme concern and opposition to the children being compelled to travel long distances to School at Okehampton when it is more convenient and cost effective for the Children to attend Tavistock School. A cppy of this letter is to be sent to County Councillors Mary Crane and Mary Vick and Mr. Friend.

Surface Water on road... The Clerk was instructed to write to Mr, Honey thanking him for his public spirited action in removing the surface water on the road close the the sign post on Bowden Down which had caused problems in the recent cold weather.

Going Places What's On... A monthly Recreation, Leisure and Entertainments magazine was being launched, to keep the Community informed of what's happening throughout the area. Advertisements for the magazine advertising functions will be free.

THE BUTTER MOUNTAIN

Hopefully, everyone who is entitled to the free EEC butter, is now receiving it in Brentor, weelkly

Thanks to the efforts and hardwwork of those volunteers in the Village who have organised the distribution of the butter, it has reached many households. The free butter will go on, hopefully, till the end of March and cheese is now becoming available. Brentor will soon be getting some of the cheese mountain too.

The butter has reached our Villages by voluntary channels. It arrives at the Salvation Army Centre in Plymouth and from there it has been up to Age Concern Tavistock and District and The Red Cross to fetch it, several cwts at a time, and bring it to Tavistock. From Tavistock, it has then, again by voluntary drivers, been taken to all the surrounding Villages for them to organise its distribution. It has created a lot of time and petrol consuming hard work for lots of volunteers, who have organised it all marvellously. None of the costs incurred by the voluntary organisations in Tavistock and the village volunteers are reclaimable from public funds. They have all had to use their own money. The Government has provided no financial or organisational help in the distribution of the EEC food. Anyone still not receiving free butter who thinks they are entitled to it
