CAR VANDALISED

Visitors from outside Brentor had their car, which was parked outside the village hall, vandalised in broad daylight. The incident, in late August, involved a boy's name being scratched in a side panel and the rear of the car was also scratched.

The re-spray work of the year-old car is estimated at over £500, and will cost them in insurance excess and loss of no-claims bonus and so on, not to mention the inconvenience of having to organise the work. The police have been informed, and if anyone knows who could be responsible could they pass on the details.

The criminal damage follows a number of incidents over the summer, including a couple at the village church, where on one occasion gift envelopes were piled up and set alight before, fortunately, those responsible had the good sense to put them out. Brentor Neighbourhood Watch are aware of the incidents.
