Mary Tavy Post Office Coronavirus: Home Delivery Service


During these uncertain times we would like to support any people who are worried about going out and/or are choosing, or been told, to self isolate.

- · Put up nesting boxes or continue
- Make ponds more wild-life friendly by creating a near-by log, twig and/or rock pile for wildlife shelter
- Put out hedgehog food
- Plant some single-flowering annuals/perennials to encourage bees & other beneficial insects
- Keep weeds under control
- Protect fruit blossom from late frosts
- Tie in climbing and rambling roses
- Sow hardy annuals, herbs and wildflower seed outdoors
- Start to feed citrus plants
- Increase the water given to houseplants
- Feed hungry shrubs and roses
- Sow new lawns or repair bare patches
- Prune fig trees
- Divide bamboos and waterlilies
