A lot has been happening at the playing field recently and although the village hall is now open it is not quite 'business as usual'.

We therefore anticipate that the playing field will become our main source of fund raising for the foreseeable future. The shelter, composting toilet and outdoor furniture are making this possible. Millie started the ball rolling with her lovely Friday mobile café and two successful car boot sales have taken place, with more planned.

A generator (funded by Friends of the Field) will enable us to cater for some of the events which would normally have been held at the village hall. The October Coffee Morning will be dedicated to Macmillan Cancer Support. A Saturday Soup and Sausage Stroll is planned for November and there will be a Festive Event in December.

Poppy Appeal 2020 under Covid 19 – celebrating 99 years of giving

The Editors of the Brentor News have kindly agreed to publish this notice about our collection this year under strict Covid-19 Rules whereby we can't do House-to-House Collections nor have any face-to-face contact without keeping to our strict rules of Social Distancing from each other. Our collection dates this year are from Saturday the 24th October until Remembrance Sunday on the 8th November. Please take the necessary Covid-19 precautions when handling any of the items we sell or distribute.

We intend to circulate (post!) in early October some poppies in "Gift–aid" envelopes around the Parish with instructions contained within as to how to return the envelopes and pick up more poppies as required. These include poppies, large and small, 2020 enamel poppy pins, some VE poppy pins, poppy bracelets, magnetic car, van and lorry poppies, wooden crosses, wrist bands and other miscellaneous items to do with the Poppy Appeal. Our team of collectors for this year are: Simon and Gaye Martin (810637), John Burrows (810494), Bob Lemon (810415), Rob Ormsby (860344) and myself (810135), although it is better if you email me if you can, as I have difficulty being understood on the telephone with my speech problem seemingly getting worse these days, unfortunately).

Last year the Parish achieved **a** magnificent sum collected of \pounds 877.17 - a significant contribution from a small village such as ours. This is so much appreciated by the Royal British Legion, whose efforts to care for so many of our wounded, mentally distressed and ageing ex-servicemen just cannot be underestimated. Thank you all so much.

Furthermore, £302.50 of last year's collection was kindly "Gift-aided", which meant an extra £75.62 for the British Legion. It does make such a difference gift aiding - an extra 25p for every pound donated to the Royal British Legion.


