Vic Cowling's Brentor

Brentorvillage.org website was recently contacted by Mr Vic Cowling, who was born in Brentor in 1941. He attended Brentor Primary School and went to secondary school in Tavistock. He left the village to join the RAF in 1961. Vic's family lived in Brentor for some 120 years. His father had a central role in the transformation of the Reading Room into the Village Hall, and was also involved in negotiations regarding the gift of

Vic has many memories of growing up in Brentor in the 1940s and 50s and has written several down for the Brentorvillage.org website. He remembers joining the postman on his village rounds and attended the Coronation sports day in 1953. Vic has also been researching the donation of a Spitfire aircraft for the war effort by the resident of Bonnaford. Here's an extract from one of his reminiscences...........

"It was 7 o'clock on a fine morning almost 70 years ago. Aged about 10/11, I was eagerly awaiting the arrival of the Post Office van from Tavistock. But I was not expecting a delivery, and I was not alone. I was in the company of Bert Batten, the village postman and our close West Blackdown neighbour. And I was about to accompany him on his delivery. The regular driver was 'Taffy' Saunders and he gave us a lift up to Brentor post office. There, under the auspices of Lena Eastcott, the postmistress, we sorted the mail into delivery order on the kitchen table. The only way I can now gauge the volume of mail is in my recall of the large number of properties at which we did not stop en route. After being suitably fortified by hot drinks, we set out......"


