Work starts on Brentor's superfast broadband network

West Blackdown homes will be connected to a new fibre broadband network by June, thanks to the Universal Service Obligation (USO) scheme. They will benefit from the latest high speed 'fibre to the premises' technology. Others properties in the village centre can also get free connection but only if enough people register for it!

If 25 homes in the north side of the village centre just register interest in the USO scheme, a cluster of 31 properties will be offered **FREE CONNECTION** to the new network........... and more could follow.

The USO scheme allows Openreach to claim a grant of £3,400 each for 70% of eligible properties, whether they register or not. That's 22 of the 31 in the cluster, leaving a shortfall of £8,358 to be raised locally. **BUT THERE IS AN EASY WAY TO GET FREE CONNECTION** - 25 people in the cluster just need to register interest in the USO scheme! The extra USO grant (3 x £3,400) will cover the £8,358 shortfall and **EVERYONE IN THE CLUSTER WILL BE OFFERED FREE CONNECTION**. BT confirms that if you register interest there is **ABSOLUTELY NO COMMITMENT** to sign up later for a fibre connection.

SO PLEASE REGISTER! We've been moaning about our poor broadband service for years and here's a chance to do something about it free of charge and with no financial commitment! So far only about 13 properties have registered - WHERE ARE THE REST OF YOU? The number to call to register is 0800 783 0223.

If you already have a poor or unreliable Airband connection you will probably qualify for a USO fibre connection, particularly if you regularly get less than 10mbps.

What about the rest of Brentor parish? - Another cluster of 13 homes around Darke Lane have been quoted £36,871 to be connected - a very divisive situation for a small community. How can it cost so much more to connect these properties compared to others in the middle of the village? However, if the cluster of 31 is connected free of charge, BT have implied that this cluster may also receive a lower estimate for connection (hopefully free?).

The Liddaton and Lydford Station areas of Brentor Parish are very disadvantaged by their poor broadband connection, served from the Chillaton and Lydford telephone exchanges. Residents in these areas are working hard to find other ways of connecting to fibre.

It's hard to understand the Universal Service Obligation scheme but there is lots more about it on the Brentor Village website. If you want to contribute information please contact me at brentorvillage@btinternet.com.

New Trustees wanted!

Origins and Activities

The Brentor Community Trust (BCT) was established in October 2007 with the aims:

" to promote and support activities which enhance education, communication and social interaction for the benefit of the community of the parish of Brentor and surrounding areas in West Devon."

It organises and financially underwrites community activities and facilities (established over a period of 40 years) that are still of significant importance to Brentor:

The Brentor News (1979)

Villages in Action (VIA), Theatre & Music events

The Brentor Living Archive (2001)

The Brentor Village Website (2009)

This has been a largely self-funding community endeavour, achieved primarily through generous voluntary support. It is managed with a light touch once the structure of each activity is agreed. Its work complements that of the Village Hall & Playing Field Committee.



There are currently four Trustees.

This year, the two office holders (Mike Whitfield - Hon Treasurer & Acting Chairman; John Wheeler - Hon Secretary) will both be retiring as Trustees, after working a total of 60 years for the BCT, and its precursor Brentor Community Centre (1978).

The two remaining Trustees will be Jane Phelpstead (Brentor News and banking of funds), and Dominic Carnell (events and Villages in Action).

The BCT must now assure its future by appointing three new Trustees and electing new officers

This would provide an opportunity to revitalise the organisation and to reconsider its role in the life of Brentor and its environs. This year will also see the publication of the 500th issue of the Brentor News. In the past, such events have been celebrated by a Special Issue and related activities. This could provide a good opportunity to launch the new arrangements.

Current status

Brentor News (1979)

This is compiled and capably managed by a resourceful team of editors which is currently looking for a new member. Costs have been reduced by more than 50 households opting for the online edition. Further cost reductions might be achieved by acquiring our own printer, but this would also make additional demands on our volunteers.

Villages in Action (VIA), Theatre & Music events

This is an ad hoc activity with organising groups coming forward when funds are available.

Brentor Living Archive (2001)

The Archive is run by John Wheeler and Mike Whitfield and so we hope that one of the new Trustees will take on this role. The online interface is being reconfigured and there are many uncatalogued items to be recorded and collated. These include digital items with related notes, paper records and miscellaneous artefacts, documents & original photographs.

Brentor Village Website (2009)


