We are looking forward to sunnier days when two sets of gardens are planned to be open for St Lukes. We would like to apologise to anyone who has been held up outside our home (Shell Park) whilst we take receipt of our home deliveries. The lane from the War Memorial to the Playing Field is unfortunately at its very narrowest where it runs alongside our home thus making it impossible for other motor vehicles to pass by, whilst a delivery is being made to us. Please be assured that we always do our very best to be as quick as we possibly can when taking receipt of any home deliveries. As a "Shielding" household we are totally dependent upon home deliveries so were extremely shocked and concerned when a supermarket we use, recently telephoned us to let us know that they had received complaints from some individuals who had been held up by their delivery lorries whilst they were making a delivery to us. This resulted in us not receiving our scheduled supermarket delivery that day! We fear our future supermarket deliveries may also be jeopardised if these anonymous complaints continue. We do of course fully appreciate how extremely frustrating it might be to get held up behind the supermarket delivery lorries, Royal Mail vans, couriers, oil tankers and occasional ambulances that need to stop for a while in the lane beside us. It's a very busy little lane with a multitude of users including local residents, horse riders, cyclists, dog walkers, walkers and farm animals alongside all the various motor vehicles that use it too. We are sincerely sorry if we should unfortunately hold anyone up who uses this lane, and wish to reassure everyone that for our part we will continue to be as quick as we possibly can when taking receipt of any deliveries. We hope that having explained our personal circumstances that those anonymous individuals who have complained or who are planning to submit complaints to those who deliver to us, will now be able to find some kindness in their heart and be just a little more patient and understanding. Mick and Peggy Biggs

Mick and Peggy had lived at the Old Post Office for over 50 years, moving here on the 1st January 1969. They ran the Post Office and Stores whilst redesigning the house, business and bringing up their four children. Four children who are all grateful for their parents moving to the beautiful village of Brentor. After the traditional Sunday roasts the afternoon walks around the village sometimes could take hours, depending on how many people we met on the way, always happy to share stories. Throughout Peggy and Mick's life here they were on many committees, Village Hall, Church Hall, PCC, WI and others. Both were very involved in the Church community with Mick being a Side's man and then

Church Warden for many years. As well as all the building work he carried out on both churches, in later years he was the key bearer opening and closing the Church every day. Alongside the Village life Mick worked as a local Builder, turning his hand to building, carpentry, decorating and roofing, all self-taught and sometimes with the help of his children, particularly David and Nick. Many homes in Brentor have Mick's handiwork woven into their structure. As well as, for many years the local school bus driver. Peggy always worked on the flowers in the Church windows with her friends Topsy Allen and Gaye Martin, many a happy afternoon in Peggy's dining room with a cup of tea and lots of flowers. After church services Peggy and Topsy would be found supplying tea, coffee, cake and a chat. Peggy was also Brown Owl for 1st Brentor Brownies for 22 years with assistance from others including both Sam and Becca. Peggy was also a keen re-cycler even then. Sewing, knitting and creating, so many craft ideas come to life. Although for the last few years things have been very challenging for us as a family with Peggy's Alzheimer's and Mick falling many times it has been of great comfort to have the strength and support from neighbours and the community of Brentor. Mick liked sitting in his living room being able to see people walking by, especially during this last year of lockdown, we did try to get out for walks as Mick's mobility and the weather allowed. Thank you for all the kindness, flowers and messages we have received following Dad's passing, we are hoping to have a memorial service for Dad when lockdown restrictions are lifted.

More of Brentor to get free fibre broadband

Not only West Blackdown homes but up to 31 properties from Brentor village centre to Hammer Park will also be getting free access to a new superfast fibre-to-the premises broadband network being built by Openreach. West Blackdown should be connected by June and BT announced on 10th March that enough residents have registered interest in the government-funded Universal Service Obligation scheme for the north side of the village centre also to be connected free of charge, although the timescale is not clear at present. Residents on the new network will have reliable superfast

broadband and the opportunity to choose their Internet Service Provider, contrasting with the lack of choice from Airband.

Don't forget that you can still register interest so that you are connected when the network is built – the number to call is <u>0800 783 0223</u>. There is no financial commitment whatsoever if you register. It's worth noting that some residents who have a poor Airband connection are eligible for the USO scheme.

So ,what about the rest of the Parish? Another 'cluster' of 13 properties in the Darke Lane area have been quoted a total of £36,871 to be connected. Even if all the owners of these properties registered interest in the USO scheme they would still be over £26,000 short the funding needed. We have to question why it costs so much more to connect these properties compared to others in the middle of the village – some will be nearer to the new fibre cable than houses being connected at no cost. However, once the cluster of 31 is connected, BT suggest that residents in the 13 cluster should reapply for the USO scheme and then they may receive a much more favourable quotation. A pity that they can't be offered free connection now and get all the network built in one go!

Residents around Liddaton, South Brentor and along the Tavistock-Lydford road still need to find a way to get access to fibre broadband. There's more about this on the Brentor Village website. Colin Dawes

Christ Church

Passers-by may have noticed that the tower at Christ Church is taped off. This is because the lime mortar is crumbling and some small pieces are falling off, partly due to weathering during the recent winter. The buttresses need repointing and the architect and the steeple jacks recommend that the work begins in May or June, to allow the lime mortar to cure sufficiently before next winter's frosts. While the steeple jacks are up there, they will also repair the netting to prevent the jackdaws nesting in the clock, so we hope that the church clock will be able to keep time and chime again.

We are looking to arrange much more major work on the tower, for which we will need substantial grants. The Damp Towers Project, run by Historic England, will be supporting our application, but the pandemic has put all such grants on hold for the time being.
