The new pilgrimage route was launched at the end of July, with a group of walkers setting off from St Michaels at 8am to meet up with walkers (and runners!) from the other end of the route, Chagford, at the halfway point at Belstone.

There is a special welcome for all pilgrims visiting the tor with biscuits and water - and pilgrim staffs for people to borrow if they wish. So far this has gone down very well indeed, although keeping up with the supply of biscuits and water is something of a challenge! We have put the visitors' book out again at St Michaels and had over 100 people signing in during the first week.

Profits are to be split between the church, Tavistock Foodbank and the Brentor Playing Field committee to go towards more children's play equipment, so please look out any items that might be suitable, make a cake or some jam, and we hope to see many of you there. Of course, we also need people to come and have a cup of tea or coffee, and have a chat!

The Churchwardens - who we are and what we do

Churchwardens are an ancient office dating from the 13th century and our role is to care for the parish, support the parishioners and ministers, and to maintain the buildings and other fabric. This role is particularly important when we have no vicar, and as our present vicar, Chris Hardwick, is retiring in October there is expected to be some time until a replacement can be appointed. If you want to enquire about weddings, funerals or baptisms we are your first port of call. Being a churchwarden at Brentor is like being in charge of a mini cathedral, with over 10,000 visitors to St Michaels every year. We are frequently dealing with journalists or film makers or TV companies, or people simply wanting to know if the church is open (it is) or when services are, or people kindly ringing us to tell us there are bees nearby, or that the tower seems to be very wet!

Many churchwardens at Brentor have been Battens over the years; Mick Biggs, who passed away this year, was also a longstanding churchwarden. The current wardens are David and Helen Harris: we were sworn in to this office in July, in front of the archdeacon and all the other local churchwardens and ministers. 
Our AGM, always a short affair, will be followed by discussions on our - delayed from 2020 - next production expected early next year, final casting, support roles, etc.
